



"The Trophy Case"

An excerpt from the Club History Book published in 1989:

At a Board of Governors meeting in the Founders Suite in 1981, the discussion turned to the rash of recent burglaries brought about by the rising price of silver. The unlocked trophy case in the corner of the room was noted as were trophies displayed in the Grill and in a case then in the fourth floor hallway. "Fortunately", one of the Governors observed, "all of these trophies must be plate". William T. Vogt Sr., then chairman of the Fine Arts Committee, was not so sure, and a quick examination proved that most were, in fact, sterling. They were hastily gathered and locked in the Manager's office, while Vogt passed the hat around the Board and other interested members. The result is the handsome, locked, trophy case just off the entrance hall. It contains most of the Club's sterling trophies and has been enhanced by gifts from the families of William Coxe Wright; the Pearsons, Senior and Junior; and Edward M. Edwards. Pewter and plate trophies are now in the Grill, the Founders Suite, and in a new case in the back of the Dorrance Room.

Stretch & Sculpt - FREE


This low-impact class incorporates strength training and stretching to tone and tighten the important muscle groups in the body. This full body workout will increase flexibility, strength, and reduce stress!
