# LETTER FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER



Dear Members,

2019 is a big year for The Racquet Club as it culminates our 130th anniversary since our incorporation in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine. Though founded in 1882, the Club was not formally organized until October 26th 1889 and then incorporated under the laws of Pennsylvania one month later on November 25th. The Club's 130 year history is a rich one; immersed with tradition and stories of both accomplishment and folly. It is our colorful

history that makes The Racquet Club a very special and unique place unlike any other club. Since 2019 is a milestone year for our fine club, management is focused on improving the member experience even more. Here is what we have in the works to make your next year at the Club the best yet:

**Grab n' Go:** Life can get busy which means not everyone has time for a sit-down meal. Our Food and Beverage team is in the process of finalizing the details of a Grab n' Go station that will offer prepackaged sandwiches, fruits, salads, chips and cookies available by signature at any time.

**Bar Cart:** We recently purchased a custom Racquet Club bar cart that will be traversing the clubhouse Monday through Friday from 5pm to 9pm. The bar cart attendant will offer members and guests top shelf spirits, bottled beer, and you can even order food from the 1889 Pub & Grille! Libations and delicious food will come to you directly so you can keep watching that great doubles match on the fourth floor instead of taking the four-flight trip to the Pub.

**Laptop Policy:** For our members that are able to get away from the office for lunch but need to stay connected, the House Committee has implemented a new policy in which laptops are permitted in select areas of the Gold Leaf Café. They are now also welcome in the President's Room on the first floor.

**Dress Code:** On March 18th, 2019 the Board of Governors approved and finalized revisions to the dress code. This change in policy reflects a recognition that standards for attire in the professional workplace environment have been evolving and that many members are frequently unable to come to the Club directly from work owing to a difference in the standards for dress between their place of business and the Club. **Playing Dues:** Club leadership has taken the first step in consolidating the All-In package with Playing Dues, which means within the next one to two years, all playing members will have unlimited court time.

**Projects:** Thanks to the work of the RC Fund and the House Committee, the Main Dining Room, Reading Room, and select Lobby and alcove areas will be freshly painted. Additionally, the wainscoting in the MDR and RR will also receive needed repairs. The RC Fund has also commissioned the restoration of select picture frames and the relocation of artwork throughout the club. All of these projects are possible through the generous donations from our members. I would be remiss if I didn't mention that the Board of Governors has authorized an initiative to begin the process of bidding for improvements to the Ladies Locker Room, with a budget of \$100,000. The ad hoc committee formed to oversee this undertaking is finalizing conceptual designs and expects to make significant progress in the near term.

**Fitness Committee:** A newly formed sub-committee of the Athletic Committee is examining current fitness offerings, such as classes, personal training, massage therapy, and physical therapy and will be making recommendations for improvements to the Board of Governors.

**Family Friendliness:** Our new Family Happy Hours have been a huge hit and we will continue to explore family programming in 2019. If you have any ideas or suggestions on how we can improve our family programing, I welcome your input.

Our management team and our dedicated staff are explorers on an unending quest to improve our facilities and services for our members. Ongoing feedback from the membership gives our team the tools to implement and perfect our services and I hope that our membership will continue to support our efforts as we implement enhancements this year and beyond.

We want to make 2019 a great year for you and we hope that you are able to enjoy all of the wonderful changes we have in store!

# HOW TO SPONSOR A NEW CANDIDATE



# **Boston Tennis & Racquet Club**

For this issue of The Racquet Club Review, we are highlighting a Back-Bay favorite. The Boston Tennis and Racquet Club has a longstanding and rich history which has been shared with our own club over the past century.

On June 10, 1902, the Tennis and Racquet Club received its charter from the Secretary of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. All of the founding members were sportsmen, and three – Richard Sears, Quincy Shaw, Jr., Philip Stockton – were champions of tennis, squash or racquets. Their new enterprise was to be Boston's counterpart to New York's exclusive Racquet and Tennis Club, and the cornerstone of the clubhouse was laid in November 1902. The clubhouse boasts three international squash courts and three North American hardball courts. Additionally, and like RCOP, the club has both a court tennis and racquets court which are regarded as of the very few remaining in the U.S.

Not all activities that take place within the confines of the clubhouse at 939 Boylston Street have necessarily been of a physically strenuous nature. Other "sports" popular among club members – billiards, backgammon, card games – continue to find devotees among the membership. The "T&R" also boasts one of the most revered après tennis or squash or racquets watering holes in the country for members and their guests.

Much like The Racquet Club, T&R also has talented squash, tennis, and racquets professionals that assist in scheduling match play with members and visitors. In addition to the many sports offerings, T&R also has a unique Fitness Center that offers private or group training.

T&R has recently restored the Hamlen Room which is now available for private functions for reciprocal members. The Hamlen Room is a refreshingly unique space that combines classic ambience with modern accommodations and a very unique view from behind the dedans section of the court tennis court.
